
Prayer & Worship



Live out our faith...



We also extend our thanks to the Retreat assistants from the Student Chaplaincy team for their help in preparing and delivering the resources.





Pastoral Care

At secondary level, the groups are called Spectrum. We are grateful to The Catholic Children's Society for the opportunity to run these programmes.

When something significant happens in a family, the entire family is affected. If a parent or sibling dies, a divorce or separation happens, or some other painful loss occurs, not only do the parents grieve, the children do also. Children and young people may find it extremely difficult to verbalise their feelings of grief because of their age and inexperience.

The Spectrum programme is a peer support programme which provides young people with a trusted adult and a group of their peers with whom they can work through their grief, build a stronger sense of self-esteem, and begin to accept what has taken place in the family.
