Key Information:

- In Denmark, there are three types of higher education institutions:
 Universities offer traditional Bachelors, Masters, and PhD degrees.
 University colleges provide vocational professional courses in areas such as nursing, engineering, and social work. Academies of professional higher education include artistic higher education institutions, schools of maritime education and training, and business academies.
- There are a total of eight universities in Denmark.
- The fees vary depending on the institution, but they are generally cheaper than in the UK, ranging from around DKK 44,742- DKK 119,312 (£5,130-£13,675) per year.
